



RELOCATION OF THE TOURISM ACADEMY @ SENTOSA IN OCTOBER 2011

Singapore, 9 February 2010 – The Tourism Academy @ Sentosa (TAS) will be returning to Temasek Polytechnic (TP) in October 2011, when the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Polytechnic and Sentosa Development Corporation (SDC) ends. The Academy, which operated as an off-campus learning institution on Sentosa, will run its courses from the Polytechnic's main campus in Tampines.

TAS was established in 2003 to provide quality service training and continuing education for industry practitioners and aspiring students in the tourism and hospitality sector. Besides offering academic courses in tourism, hospitality and resort management, the Academy also caters to the training needs of SDC staff and other island partners on Sentosa. Even as it moves back to the mainland, TAS is committed to tying up with attractions, hotels and restaurants on Sentosa to enable its students to continue to enjoy opportunities for a hands-on experience.

TAS is currently housed in four heritage buildings at Sentosa's historical Parade Square. The 50,000-square feet site has been earmarked for future development, to extend the range of leisure and lifestyle offerings on the island.

Our relocation to the main campus will be a strategic effort to consolidate our resources and further grow our hospitality and tourism programmes under one roof."
