Have a Merry Green Christmas at Sentosa

Go green at Sentosa this Christmas with environmental activities for both young and old

22 November 2010 - Do you know that the total amount of waste collected on Sentosa alone comes up to a whopping 1,327 tonnes a year? This is equivalent to the weight of 265,400 adult peacocks.

This holiday, Sentosa will be putting that waste to good use. Sentosa has joined hands with its employees, island partners, guests and Sentosa Cove residents to hold a series of activities aimed at protecting the environment and spreading the word on the importance of recycling.

"Recycling should be a fun and essential part of our lives and it's time we took it beyond our homes," said Regina Chia, Sentosa Leisure Group Programming Manager. "This year-end recycling programme at Sentosa will help to spread the message of the three 'R's – Reduce, Recycle and Reuse to both parents and young kids. It's going to be a real celebration of what a green Christmas looks like."

• Green Christmas Trees

Catch the four-metres high O' Christmas Tree, made from more than 1,000 used glass bottles, and a Japanese Origami Christmas tree created out of over 30 pieces of recycled Sentosa event posters and brochures, at the Merlion Plaza.

• "Storytelling Comes Alive"

Back by popular demand, Mervyn Goh, Singapore's leading theatre actor engages children with classic festive stories based on the Gingerbread Man story. Children will also get to meet the Gingerbread Man and his friends at his colourful, recycled house filled with festive decorations made from baked gingerbread dough, Gingerbread Man figurines and recycled materials from Sentosa's Central Kitchen! The classic stories will carry messages such as caring for the environment and recycling.

Then be sure to look out for the 1-metre tall Gingerbread Man plush toy, made from old Sentosa banners and posters, at the Sentosa Express Station at VivoCity.

• "Gifts of Mother Nature"

Guests will also be able to bring home Christmas gifts and ornaments they have crafted out of plastic bottle caps, tin cans, and sweet wrappers at one of these hands-on workshops for their loved ones.

• The 'Recycled Art' Exhibition

They say one man's trash is another man's treasure. In an interesting take on art, Sentosa has worked with the Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA) to design and build **13** sculptures from recycled materials collected from around the island. The 'Recycled Art' exhibition demonstrates how waste materials can be reused and turned into beautiful pieces of artwork. Glass bottles, old newspapers and plastic bags may seem like trash to some, but these are the building blocks behind these one-of-its-kind sculptures, conceptualised by a group of innovative students from NAFA.
