**Journey into the island's hidden wild side with the
refreshed Sentosa Nature Discovery**



SINGAPORE, 1 August 2025 – Get ready to embark on an immersive journey that uncovers the hidden wonders of the island's ecosystems at the refreshed **Sentosa Nature Discovery** which reopens to the public on 2 August. The revamped space has been designed to spotlight Sentosa's rich biodiversity and ongoing conservation efforts through interactive exhibits and storytelling.

More than just a nature trail, this revitalised experience with five zones serves as an environmental learning hub, offering place-based education that deepens understanding of sustainability, biodiversity, and the lesser-known natural stories of Sentosa.

Located at Imbiah Lookout, admission is free for all so bring a curious mind and open eyes as you explore at your own pace, connect with nature, and discover how you can play a part in protecting our natural world.

What to Expect:

Swiftlet Bunker



Uncover **The Swiftlet Bunker**, one of the key features of the refreshed Sentosa Nature Discovery. The Swiftlet Bunker is a replica of the original World War II bunker on Imbiah Hill, a former strategic military post that remains under restricted access to the public. Today, the underground bunker has become home to the largest known colony of the Edible-nest and Black-nest Swiftlets in Singapore, with more than 250 nests.



This zone offers visitors a rare opportunity to step into a reimagined version of the site and explore how this former military bunker has evolved into an unexpected sanctuary for wildlife. Get ready to step into the shoes of a researcher and discover the hidden world of the swiftlet colony at Imbiah Bunker through an interactive, hands-on survey activity.

Interactive features such as rare video footages of swiftlet nest-building collected over the years, a glimpse of their nests painstakingly weaved from their saliva for raising their young, even viewing real and replica nests. Visitors can also experience the dark and narrow passages where swiftlets navigate through echolocation, a special ability rarely seen in other birds, and discover many other interesting insights on these special birds and their unique habitat and behaviours.

Unique Floral and Fauna of Sentosa



From native wildlife to rare ecological treasures, visitors can learn fascinating facts about the plant and animal species that call Sentosa home – some of which include the Smooth-coated Otter, Mantis Shrimp and Seashore Mangosteen.

Habitats of Sentosa

This zone highlights the island's diverse ecosystems, including coastal and secondary forests, mangroves, coral reefs, seagrass meadows, and urban landscapes. Through engaging displays, visitors can learn about the unique biodiversity each habitat supports and the plants that shape the environment to the animals that depend on them.

Conservation Efforts



Peek behind the scenes at the innovative projects and passionate people safeguarding Sentosa's land and sea to understand how these efforts are actively shaping a more sustainable future for the island.

Nature Cinema

Visitors can take a seat at this cinema and be transported by SENTOSA, a short film that reveals the island's bold efforts to protect its natural wonders and build a sustainable future. Produced by Earth in Focus, the film offers a compelling look at conservation through the eyes of a native Sentosa islander.

As part of the launch, Sentosa will be rolling out a **Nature Discovery Series**, from 2 August to 10 August, which involves a curated lineup of free interactive programmes designed to spark curiosity, deepen appreciation for biodiversity, and make nature exploration even more fun for all ages. Highlights include:

- **Nature Navigators (3-10 August 2025):** Embark on a guided adventure across Sentosa's diverse green spaces. Participants will take on eco-challenges that test their wit, endurance, and teamwork, all while uncovering the island's rich natural heritage.
- **Birds and Bunkers: Imbiah Field Notes (2 Aug 2025):** In collaboration with the Bird Society of Singapore, this citizen science session invites participants to observe, identify, and document local bird species. They'll also get rare access to a hidden World War II bunker that now serves as a home to a thriving swiftlet colony.

- **Wild Tales (9-10 Aug 2025):** Perfect for curious minds and little explorers, this cozy storytelling session sparks creativity, builds a love for the environment, and connects young hearts to the beauty of the wild.
- **Explorer's Bingo (2-10 Aug 2025):** A fun, all-ages scavenger hunt that blends learning with play—encouraging curiosity, observation, and a deeper appreciation for the great outdoors.

Annex B – Sentosa’s unique flora and fauna

 <p>Credit: Teo Siyang</p>	<p>Ridley’s <i>Fagraea</i> (<i>Fagraea ridleyi</i>) [Plants feature]</p> <p>Sentosa is home to the only three individuals known in Singapore! This slow-growing climber clings onto Sentosa’s cliffs with their strong root systems despite challenging terrain and strong winds.</p>
 <p>Credit: Raffles Bulletin of Zoology</p>	<p>Mantis Shrimp (<i>Gonodactylus sentosa</i>) [Marine feature]</p> <p>This Mantis Shrimp was described in 2016 by researchers and was named after Sentosa, the location where the type specimen was collected from. Wielding lightning-fast claws, they spear and smash their prey in our intertidal areas.</p>
 <p>Credit: Rene Ong</p>	<p>Hornet-mimicking Hoverfly (<i>Milesia vespoides</i>) [Insects feature]</p> <p>This hoverfly was sighted on Sentosa in 2020, and besides another sighting on Pulau Ubin in 2019, it was not seen in Singapore for almost 200 years.</p>
 <p>Credit: Jeremy Yeo</p>	<p>Smooth-coated Otter (<i>Lutra perspicillata</i>) [Mammals feature]</p> <p>These playful mammals form tight-knit family units, and our island’s resident otters that are fondly known as the “Sentosa Family”. This family has successfully adapted to our island landscapes and are frequently seen along our shores.</p>
 <p>Credit: Jeremy Yeo</p>	<p>Oriental Pied Hornbill (<i>Anthracoceros albirostris</i>) [Birds feature]</p> <p>The population of these large birds are thriving on Sentosa, usually seen in pairs around the island. When breeding, the female seals the opening of tree cavities with mud and plant fibres, leaving a small opening for the male to deliver food.</p>
