### **KUSU PILGRIMAGE 2015**

**Singapore, 17 September 2015** – The 2015 Kusu Pilgrimage will take place between 13 October and 11 November. This annual pilgrimage to the legendary Tortoise or Kusu Island attracts thousands of devotees who would go to the island to pay homage at the Da Bo Gong (Tua Pek Kong) Temple.

During this period, ferries to Kusu Island will depart from the Marina South Pier, starting at 6.30am on weekends and public holidays, and 7am on weekdays. The last ferry will depart from Marina South Pier at 5pm and leave Kusu Island at 7pm daily. All regular ferry services to St John's Island will be temporarily suspended during this time.

The public is advised to use public transportation to get to Marina South Pier. Due to limited parking lots at Marina South Pier, those who drive are advised to park their vehicles at the Marina Bay Cruise Centre (MBCC) and take the SBS Transit Bus 402 to Marina South Pier. Alternatively, they can use the pedestrian linkway and walk from the MBCC to Marina South Pier (approximately 500 metres). On Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays, the public can also take the free shuttle bus service from the MBCC to the Marina South Pier.

Below are some useful tips for guests going on the pilgrimage:

- Devotees and visitors are encouraged to visit Kusu Island during weekdays and off-peak hours
- Wear comfortable attire and shoes for walking around the island
- Stalls serving vegetarian food will be available on the island
- As a mark of respect for the Muslim shrines on the island, please refrain from bringing any food items which may contain pork or lard to the island
- Do not bring your pets

### About Kusu Pilgrimage

One of Singapore's Southern Islands, Kusu Island is home to the popular Da Bo Gong (Tua Pek Kong) Temple and the Kramats built to commemorate the 19<sup>th</sup> century pious man Syed Abdul Rahman, his mother Nenek Ghalib and sister Puteri Fatimah.

Every year during the ninth lunar month, tens of thousands of devotees make their way to Kusu Island for the annual Kusu Pilgrimage. This year's Kusu Pilgrimage period is from 13 October to 11 November 2015.

### Getting To Kusu Island:

To get to Kusu Island, you can take a ferry from Marina South Pier. During the Kusu Pilgrimage period, the ferry arrangements are as follows:

#### Ferry Schedule

The first ferry departs Marina South Pier at 7am from Monday to Friday, and at 6.30am on weekends and public holidays.

The frequency of ferry departures is approximately 30 minutes.

Last ferry departs Marina South Pier at 5pm daily.

Last ferry departs Kusu Island at 7pm daily.

### **Getting to Marina South Pier – Public Transportation:**

The public is encouraged to use public transportation to get to Marina South Pier.

#### Bus

SBS Transit Bus 402 runs a service between Shenton Way Terminal, Anson Road, Cecil Street, Marina Boulevard, Marina South Pier, MBCC and Marina South Pier daily. Some of the bus stops along the service route are at International Plaza, The Sail, Marina Bay Financial Centre.

#### MRT

Alight at Marina South Pier MRT station (N28).

#### Taxi

Alight at the taxi drop-off point located at the Marina South Coastal Drive. Taxis are not allowed to wait or park in the Marina South Coastal Drive on weekends and public holidays during the Kusu Pilgrimage period.

### **Getting to Marina South Pier – Driving:**

In view of limited parking lots at the Marina South Pier, motorists are advised to park their vehicles at the MBCC carpark.

#### Parking at Marina South Pier

On weekdays, there are limited parking spaces available at Marina South Pier (EPS parking). Motorists may also park at MBCC car park and board SBS Transit 402 which ply between MBCC and Marina South Pier.

There will be controlled entry into Marina South Pier Carpark from 6.00 am to 5.00 pm on weekends and public holidays during the Kusu Pilgrimage period. Only authorised vehicles, with valid parking labels, will be allowed to enter and park at this carpark. Motorists are advised to park their vehicles at MBCC carpark, and use the free shuttle-bus services plying between MBCC and Marina South Pier. Alternatively, they could use the covered pedestrian linkway from MBCC to Marina South Pier.

#### Free Shuttle Service on Weekends and Public Holidays

A free shuttle-bus service will run between the MBCC carpark and Marina South Pier from 6.00 am to 8.00 pm on weekends and public holidays during the Kusu Pilgrimage period. The frequency of the shuttle service is approximately every 15 minutes.

The table below shows the dates and times when controlled entry to Marina South Pier carpark will be imposed, and the availability of the free shuttle services between MBCC carpark and Marina South Pier.
